4. Justification for Proposal

- 1. Retention & Recruitment: Bangor's current wages are below market averages.
- 2. Equity: Step increases reward experience and tenure, similar to practices in surrounding towns.
- 3. Regional Competitiveness: Aligns Bangor wages with county averages without exceeding reasonable limits.

I respectfully request that the City Council consider increasing the starting and step wages for Public Works employees to make them more competitive with other municipalities in Van Buren County and surrounding communities. Currently, Bangor's entry-level wage of \$17 per hour, rising to \$21 after four years, falls below average, where similar positions start at \$20–\$23 per hour and can exceed \$24 within a few years. I propose adjusting the starting wage to \$19 per hour, with step increases reaching \$24 per hour after five years, providing fair compensation that recognizes experience and tenure. Updating our wage structure will help reduce turnover, improve employee morale, and support consistent, reliable maintenance of our city's infrastructure.
