COMMENTS.

Darla McCrumb, Councilmember: The cemetery cannon project invoice going from \$8K to \$21K is an example of why we need be careful going forward and follow proper policy and procedure. This invoice should have come back to the City Council for additional approval before the \$21K was agreed upon.

Lynne Farmer, Mayor: On the T&A2 List of Invoices sheet, please identify what the pass through taxes are for on each item.

a. Department Head Reports

8. OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT.

There were no public comments.

9. UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

a. Bryce Saylor's Total Lawn Care Invoices.

Scott Graham, City Attorney gave an update on the review of the invoices. The Attorney reports that the first stage of the review is completed. He recommends that the next stage is to allow and Abonmarche, City Engineer of Record to inspect, evaluate, and give cost estimates on jobs throughout the City completed by Bryce Saylor's Total Lawn Care. Abonmarche will need to determine the amount of money the City might need to recover and if any of the work requires correction. They can also identify pieces of work that were not up to industry standards and the best estimates of costs to re-do the work. This information will give the City Council the amount of money the city might need to recover, if any.

COMMENTS.

Tony McGhee, Abonmarche: Tony explains that a priority list needs to be made with the winter months coming. There has been concern that the snow plows could be damaged by concrete patches. It is explained that those areas could be mapped out and going into snowy months the snow plow driver could lift up the blade a little in order avoid damaging the blade. There is not adequate time to secure asphalt going into winter.

Jerry Muenzer, Councilmember: What would the timeline be? Answer from Abonmarche: It would take about 1 to 1 ½ weeks to assess the areas in question, around November 15th they could have the information compiled. Answer from Attorney: A deadline isn't necessary but getting it completed as soon as possible is best. There would need to be a priority list for getting repair work done.

Darla McCrumb, Councilmember: Will this require the current work to be torn up? Answer from Abonmarche: Not necessarily, investigation will need to be done first to determine the answer. They will be very selective in what does and doesn't need to be torn up.

Amber Garcia, Councilmember: Will the City be paying a second time for the work? Answer from Attorney: Yes, up front to get the work corrected. If need be, a demand can be made to recover the money. Not certain of the answer until a thorough investigation is completed by Abonmarche.

Motion to allow Abonmarche to do an evaluation and cost estimate of the Bryce Saylor's Total Lawn Care invoices.

The City is not in debt. It's like using your savings account. The auditors don't like to see a large fund balance. She then read the current bank balances.

Stephenie Cagle, Treasurer: There will be three more budget amendments for the remainder of the fiscal year. They are quarterly.

10. NEW BUSINESS.

a. City Manager Report.

Justin Weber, Interim City Manager: Updates on general office operations, emails for all employees and city council, new website is coming along and should be live shortly, meeting with local business regarding possible ideas and uses for the Train Depot, tree removal in front of Dr. Hermann's office – DPW removed, now the stump needs to be removed, construction projects, AEP storing equipment in dump area and in return will clean the dump for free, and next fiscal year projects – bridge project that you'll hear about tonight. Procurement policies will be reviewed and discussed at the 11/20/23 Regular City Council meeting. Woodside Construction will be working on DPW metal roof soon.

Purchasing Procurement Policy from City Attorney was submitted for review and discussion at the 11/20/23 Regular City Council meeting.

b. Second Street Bridge.

Jox Moxey with Fleis & Vandenbrink spoke about the need for this bridge project. We have five (5) bridges in our City. They are our most expensive asset and we want to protect them. There is MDOT funding available to cover 95% of the construction costs.

Motion to accept Fleis & Vandenbrink proposal for Second Street Bridge for the 2024/2025 fiscal year.

COMMENTS.

Amber Garcia, Councilmember: When the bridge at Arlington gets hit, does it jeopardize the integrity of the structure? Answer from Fleis & Vandenbrink: No, they are built to withstand impact. They are inspected by CSX each time something hits it.

Lynne Farmer, Mayor: The new blinking lights are helping warn people so they do not hit the bridge.

Stephenie Cagle, Treasurer: ACT 51 money can cover the 5% that the City would be responsible for.

c. Skid Steer & Accessories.

Justin Weber, Interim City Manager presented a quote from Kubota for a Skid Steer and accessories. Proposed that the City get a four year loan not to exceed \$85,000.00 to purchase the skid steer and four accessories (snow plow, angle blade, snow blower and bucket). DDA would reimburse the City for the cost of the Skit Steer, the City would be responsible for the accessories around \$25,000.00. That would be about \$7,500.00 per year for four (4) years. Kubota is giving the City a \$17,000.00 in discounts. In the past DDA has provided snow plow services to the downtown district. With this equipment the DPW would be able to do snow plowing during the snow season and not an outside contractor.

Comment front public attendee about how Kubota is the best equipment/company. They are local, reliable and will offer replacement equipment if yours is being repaired. Kubota comes highly recommended by others and the DDA. Short discussion that we need three (3) quotes before making a decision and we need to take the advice of experts.

It is decided that two more quotes need to be obtained and presented at the 11/20/23 Council Meeting before further discussion or decisions will be made.

d. Appoint Mark Hills to DDA.

Motion to appoint Mark Hills to DDA with the term of 01/01/2021 to 12/31/2024.
